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What is your vision for the future of the university?

I think all universities will be very devoted to solve global challenges we all face. And so this is what I foresee for universities for the future. Just for one final point, I also think universities will have less less barriers than they have today. If we think about the EUA vision for 2030, for example, universities without walls, that's what I mean with that. So besides being more multicultural, universities will also be in a more intense relationship with society, in the sense that we will all contribute.
