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Students of the future will be, I hope, much more demanding than those of today. So because they will have access to information in a rapid flow, instantly, depending on their questions, by means of artificial intelligence, there will be more demanding in what they will be offered at universities. So I think the traditional ways of teaching and learning, the less engaged environments in terms of engagement in the community, will be less attractive to students. So they will be more demanding in that respect. So universities are a space to meet people, to collaborate, to solve the problems, challenges. They will be asked to more and more think critically and I think we are all afraid of artificial intelligence but it is in my view a tool to process information faster and to indeed critically think and cooperate with others towards the production of knowledge more rapidly. I think this relationship with research will also be more tight than it has been, and students will be more involved in both learning autonomously and collaboratively, by collaborating in research from early on in their curriculum path.
