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Well, I think that maybe in the future, maybe in three or four years, the online programs, we may know better than online programs because it's still something new after the pandemic. It's something that we saw from 1 to 1,000 programs in 6 months. I mean, between 2020 and 2021, 2022, we have thousands and thousands of online programs today, graduate, undergraduate, and with different names. So I think that it's a challenge for the system, for the agencies, for the students, for the university, to try to put together all this experience and trying to find a path so we know where we're going with this program.

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I think it's not going to be everything the same, but in five years, in ten years, maybe we still will validate, we will give a lot of value to face-to-face programs because they can guarantee a better... At the end of this, it's a learning experience, what we try to find for the students. I mean, the main objective for every program is the students. in the future to get the best experience, especially in strategic programs like technology programs for the future, like health-related programs for the future, they need a stronger face-to-face learning experience. With all that means the learning experience, yeah, assessment, classes, exercises, whatever is included in the learning experience, but a big part of that learning experience will go back to face-to-face or in-class experience.
